Descriptive Report to Accompany

Maliko Gulch to Kahakuloa Point
Maui, T. H.

At the extreme east, the land slopes gently upward away from the shore but from Paia westward the coast gradually becomes low & level. All of this eastern section of the sheet is cultivated for sugar cane. Northwest of Kahului the coast consists of barren sand hills for a distance of 4 miles. A narrow belt of low land lies between the sand ridges & the shore line & back of the sand hills sugar cane flourishes. From Kaihee Point N. E. W. $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Kahakuloa Head the coast becomes gradually more & more rugged & barren. Over this section the mountain ridges from the interior project out to the water's edge & terminate in bold bluffs two to four hundred feet high. This region on the extreme northwest being particularly deeply eroded & rugged.

The shore line from Maliko westward gradually changes from rocky bluffs 50 ft. high to sand beach. Grass fringes the rocky ledges from Maliko to Paia. From Paia to Kahului sand dunes & algaroba trees line the shore. Pebble & sand beaches extend from Kahului to Kaihee Point fringed with a sparse growth of grass. From Kaihee Point to Kahakuloa Head is a

gulches break thru to sea level. A part
of the beach is a small bay.

The survey was controlled by triangulation furnished by the Territorial Survey Office C & G. Survey work executed in 1899 & recent supplementary triangulation.

The gap in the shore line is covered by the 1:10,000 sheet of Kahului Harbor.
