This sheet shows the last of the cane hand and of the cliff line, both of which have been continuous since Sheet "A", Hilo. excepting, for the cane, the stretch between Waipio Valley and Pololu Gulch. The West side is an apparently smooth slope to the mountain, but in places is made up of innumerable small knolls: it has a yellow appearance due to the decomposing lava rock, and there is practically nothing growing for over a mile inland and up.

The Hawaii Railway, previously described, continues along this sheet to its terminus at Mahukona: in consequence of this road the landing at Honoipu is being abandoned as all freight and sugar will be handled at Mahukona.

There is a new road out of Mahukona to the North

Between Honoipu and Mahukona there only one or two occupied houses, and From Mahukona S.to Kawaihae there is a stretch of absolutely unoccupied land, the reason being no water and no soil: however at one time, probably one hundred years ago, this latter stretch along the coast was thiskly inhabited for there are to-day hundreds of the native stone houses common to that period, and for the most part standing in as good shape as if but recently built: here and there are evidences of artistic tendencies in the way of fancy winding stone walks edged with bright colored bits of coral. It is claimed that many years ago this coast had a different climate.

Old charts show names along this coast above mentioned but I have talked with Many natives and could verify nome but Malaea Pt. They are familiar with the names I mention but are unable to assigh them to any particular points or inlets, and as I say, there are now no vil lages. It would seem that these names are more connected with traditions than with present localities.

Also I tried to verify chart names.

Also I tried to verify chart names Eastward from Upola Pt.as given on chart4115, although those I interviewed were not familiar with these names I do not say they are not correct: what names as are locally known asfar as I could learn, I have put on my sheet.

This chart shows roads from Mahukona to Puu Hue and Kawaihae to Puu Hue: these are but faint horse trails (see sheet)

The light at Kawaihae, F.R. is sixty ft. above H.W. and on top of trestle about 34ft high: close to the shore a little less than a mile N.W. the algeroba trees have grown to such an expent as materially to injure the effectiveness of this light: when a vessel leaves Mahukona for Kawaihae she cannot because of this pick up the light till close at hand.

The light should be raised or the trees cut: the latter is suggested. is suggested.
