DESCRIPTIVE REPORT.

To accompany topog. sheet "A", sta. Puu o Kaiaka to sta. Puu iloi, Molokai Id. T.H.
May, 1915. Eoline R. Hand, Asst., Chief of Party.

This sheet embraces the S.W. corner of the island of Molokai, Hawaii. The land is of even, gentle slope, more steep on S. than on W. side, and the S. side is deeply eroded. This side shows a scant growth of grass, while that on W. side is more heavy. This end of the island is very dry.

The S. shore is nearly all sand beach: the W. shore is rock alternating with sand. At N. end of sheet is a remarkable beach about two miles long and three hundred feet wide. Several boat landings have been indicated along W. coast.

No offlying dangers were noticed except the well known reef which starts at station Fin. Its position could only be approximated: it is nearly always indicated by a line of breakers.

The S. shore is lined with a dense growth of algeroba: this tree has a tassel that is attractive to honey bees and as a result the making of honey is an important industry on this island. The road shown runs from Kaunakakai to an apiary which is between the windmill and house below sta. Wailei. A trail continues from here over the end of the island and along the coast.

This land is under lease to the Molokai Ranch (Chas. Cooke, Mgr.) and is used for cattle grazing: stock are watered from tanks conveniently placed, the water being supplied by long pipe lines. There are also a number of deer roaming over this area. The windmills, placed on the bluff to be above the trees, are rigged to pumps below, and keep tanks filled with brackish water for stock.

I have omitted many names that are on chart 4116. These names do not now apply to any definite place, village, etc. but for the most part have a legendary significance. Except for a stray fisherman or a water tender, this entire region is uninhabited.

The light is described on the sheet. Light List gives height as 151 ft. Not wishing to show a disagreement with values of another govt. bureau without good cause, I took especial pains in securing a height for this light. After seven tests, made with carefully adjusted instrument, and from different positions, both from the beach and from a station directly below the lamp, I made the height 142 ft.

Several useful beacons have been indicated, both cairns and cliff corners. The sta. Mihaapilani is especially prominent, being on a sharp cone which now has a whitewashed cairn, with all surrounding boulders whitewashed. Said to be very conspicuous from sea.
