<u>DESCRIPTION</u> of <u>LOCALITY</u>: Kaunakakai waterfront consists of a few wooden houses showing thru the trees, and a mole ending in a wooden wharf extending a half mile off the shore.

East of the wharf the shoreline presents a narrow stretch of sand beach backed by dense algeroba growth. West of the wharf extends a region of marsh and tidal flats.

About 3/4 miles west of the wharf is a large and prominent coconut grove.

CHANGES: The only change noticeable in the shoreline is an apparent building up of the tidal flats to the west of the wherf
